

BERWIND LAKE WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA,

in McDowell County contains 93 acres of rugged mountain terrain common to the southern portion of the state.

Elevations range from 1,642 feet to 2,628 feet and the majority of the area is heavily forested. Oak and hickory dominate the woodlands, which also have some beech and maple cover.



Interstate 77 northbound and southbound: Take I-77 to

Princeton, WV, to Exit 9, U.S. Route 460W. Stay on 460W to Tazewell, VA. At Exit 2, take state Route 16N. Stay on 16N to War, WV. Once in War, go to the end of the city limits and make a left across the bridge. Follow road to the park entrance (about three miles). Make a right into the park entrance and follow signs to facilities.


Visitors are responsible for observing park rules and regulations.
