

Tomlinson Run State Park

LOCATED AT THE EXTREME TIP of West Virginia's northern panhandle, **Tomlinson Run State Park** provides a wide range of recreational opportunities. The park's 1,398 acres extend along the stream from which the park gets its name, both of which are named for a family of early settlers. Roughly divided into two sections, the wilderness area offers heavily forested hills, overhanging cliffs of sandstone and shale, and a profusion of wildflowers. Featured within the developed area of the park are picnicking, boating, miniature golf, basketball and volleyball courts, disc golf, swimming, waterslide, campground and group camp. In addition, events are scheduled from April through December.

WHAT IS A YURT?

Though generally classified as a tent, the yurt is much stronger and weather tight. Traditionally, a yurt is a portable, felt-covered, wood lattice-framed dwelling structure used by nomads in the steppes of Central Asia.

The word "yurt" is originally from the Turkic word meaning "dwelling place." In Russian, the structure is called "yurta," from which the English word is derived.



Our yurts are circular structures that consist of a durable fabric cover, tension band and a wood frame that includes a lattice wall, radial rafters, central compression ring and a framed door. Yurt rental is a unique offering only at Tomlinson Run and is perfect for the novice camper. All yurts come complete with a cooler, a propane stove, lantern, picnic table and cookware.

RESERVATIONS

Tomlinson Run State Park directly or by dialing 1-800-CALL WVA and asking for Tomlinson Run State Park. This toll-free line may be used anywhere in the continental United States or any Canadian province in the Eastern time zone.

Reservations may be made by mail, phone or in person at least seven days in advance, for a minimum of two nights to a maximum of 14. Reservations are accepted beginning February 15 by mail only for the period from Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day. In addition to the usual fee, a handling charge of \$5 per site and the complete camping fee will be required as a deposit.

Yurts

This program provides the user with all the gear necessary for overnight camping in style. Reservations for yurts are accepted beginning February 15 by mail only for the period from Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day and are handled in the same manner as a regular campsite rental. Reservation applications are available online.
