Amtrak Service & Ridership

Amtrak operates two National Network trains serving West Virginia:

- The *Capitol Limited* (daily Washington-Martinsburg-Pittsburgh-Chicago)
- The *Cardinal* (tri-weekly New York-Washington-Charleston-Huntington-Cincinnati-Chicago)

Host Railroads & On Time Performance

Amtrak relies heavily on the cooperation of other railroads in order to operate routes using tracks that are not owned or controlled by Amtrak. Host railroads are statutorily required to provide Amtrak trains "preference" over freight transportation. However, on time performance on most host railroads is poor and continues to decline largely due to hosts ignoring their statutory responsibilities.

Listed below are the Amtrak services that operate in West Virginia with each service's host railroads and on-time performance (OTP) in FY19:

Amtrak Guest Rewards

At the end of FY19, there were **14,915** members of the Amtrak Guest Rewards program in West Virginia. This is a 10% increase from FY18.

Procurement

Amtrak spent \$4,157,835 on goods and services in West Virginia in FY19, including \$3,916,742 at Sutton.

Employment

At the end of FY19, Amtrak employed 30 West Virginia residents. Total wages during FY19 of Amtrak employees living in West Virginia were \$3,282,840.

Stations

Improving ADA Accessibility: Amtrak is undertaking work at and around stations as part of a nationwide effort to achieve compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Amtrak has advanced design plans to address station deficiencies such as path of travel from parking and the public right-of-way to stations, construct new passenger boarding platforms, doorways, waiting room seating, restrooms, lighting and signage. Alderson, Harpers Ferry, and Thurmond station projects are advancing through design with construction anticipated in FY2020.
